#### **ACKNOWLEDGEMENT**

Ku Arts acknowledges the many Aboriginal peoples on whose land we live and work. We recognise the Kaurna yarta where our office is based and pay our respects to the Kaurna people as the custodians of this land, sky and water.

Ku Arts pays respects to elders past and present, especially our founders, the artists of the Anangu Pitjantjatjara Yankunytjatjara (APY) lands. #### **PROGRAM OVERVIEW**

**Location: Darwin, Northern Territory** 

Dates: Wednesday 4th - Sunday 7th August 2022

Ku Arts conducted its annual Activate program (formally known as Darwin SICAD Professional Development Program) for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander artists from across South Australia. The Activate Program is for artists who have demonstrated a commitment to their creative and cultural practice and are seeking further industry engagement and advice on the professionalisation of their work.

Ku Arts has been delivering this program since 2018. In previous years, artists who attended the program were identified through participation in SICAD programs as well as being identified by regional Country Arts SA staff.

The 2022 program saw many people express their interest by submitting an EOI directly to Ku Arts, outlining how this experience would better inform and inspire their art practice. In total 8 artists from across South Australia were successful and were supported by 2 Ku Arts staff members, and one Ku Arts director.

The program was delivered over a 5-day industry engagement opportunity, commencing in Adelaide and traveling to Darwin to attend the Darwin Aboriginal Art Fair (DAAF), the Telstra NATSIAA's (National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Art Awards), and other industry events, including the SALON des Refusees, UNTOLD panel discussions and DAAF artistic masterclasses.

Ku Arts is the peak service organisation for Aboriginal artists and art centres in South Australia, founded in 1998 by women artists from the APY lands. Through our Statewide Indigenous Community Arts Development (SICAD) Program we provide services and programs to all Aboriginal artists across ten regions and 46 language groups across South Australia.

#### **ITINERARY - EVENT DESCRIPTIONS**

#### **Telstra NATSIAA (National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Art Awards)**

The *Telstra National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Art Awards* (NATSIAA) exhibition is Australia's richest art awards. This exhibition captures the attention of the nation, with an inspiring breadth of work from around Australia.

*Telstra NATSIAA* is the longest-running and most prestigious Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Art Award. Experience the richness and diversity of current contemporary Indigenous artistic practice, and the pre-eminence of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander voices, nationwide, within the visual arts.

#### **Darwin Aboriginal Art Fair (DAAF)**

The Darwin Aboriginal Art Fair (DAAF) is an annual event that showcases the contemporary fine art of more than 70 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Art Centres. The Fair is held in Darwin, on Larrakia Country. DAAF provides a unique opportunity for arts industry buyers, and art and design lovers, to purchase art directly from Indigenous-owned and incorporated Art Centres.

The Fair showcases the work of emerging and established artists, featuring stunning art inspired by Australia's most varied locations – from remote desert and coastal regions to rural and urban communities. A wide range of styles, mediums and products are presented and available for purchase: paintings on canvas, bark paintings, works on paper including limited edition prints, sculpture, didgeridoos, fibre art and cultural regalia.

DAAF also provides a creative space for visitors to meet artists in person, to learn about Australia's rich diverse cultural groups and to be immersed in our country's evolving contemporary Indigenous art scene.

#### Darwin Aboriginal Art Fair (DAAF) Artist Masterclass Lino Printing on Fabric Masterclass with Kieren Karritpul

In this Lino Printing on fabric Masterclass, participants had the opportunity to learn directly from Merrepen Arts, 2020 Textile artist of the year winner Kieren Karritpul. Kieren demonstrated textile lino printing techniques where participants had the opportunity to make their very own piece to take home.

## Darwin Aboriginal Art Fair (DAAF) Artist Masterclass Ghostnet Work with Gab Titui Cultural Centre artist Nancy Kiwat

From earrings to bags and sculptures, participants were guided through the intricacies of Ghostnet work, by artist Nancy Kiwat from the Gab Titui Cultural Centre.

#### **OUTCOMES AND SUCCESSES**

The participants who attended the 2022 Activate Program provided overwhelmingly positive feedback about their experience and the opportunities this program provided them.

As well as the planned outcomes outlined below, this program provided greater and more organic opportunities and successes that we could never have planned for, some of these are listed below:

#### **Planned outcomes**

- Connecting with commercial galleries, DAAF organisers, artists from art centres and industry leaders
- Experiencing DAAF and observing art centre stalls, price points, displays, products and marketing
- Experiencing a range of exhibitions, observing materials used, size, forms
- Developing artistic skills by participating in DAAF creative workshops

#### **Successes**

- Greater social media following for Ku Arts accounts Instagram and Facebook.
- Networking and professional development opportunities for participants such as;
  - Meeting with Claire Summers Executive Director from DAAF, who spoke about independent
    artists accessing the art fair and invited Ku Arts to put forward an application in supporting
    independent artists in future DAAF events. The participants were very excited about this
    prospect.
  - Meeting with Matt Ward, gallerist from Outstation Gallery. Matt spoke about connecting and building relationships with galleries. The group asked some great questions about material use and ways to display works, how to establish positive relationships with galleries, and price points.
  - Meeting with Franchesca Cubillo, DAAF Chair and Australia Council for the Arts Executive Director.
- One of our participants was a finalist in the NATSIAA's and she kindly shared her VIP invitation to some of our other participants to allow them to attend VIP artists' events and discussions. This opportunity also provided these artists with greater networking opportunities.
- Some of our participants were fortunate to have connected with their family members, some of whom they had never met.
- Although the group represented varied demographics and diverse art practices, the youngest participant was 17 and the oldest 72 years, they all came together and formed strong relationships and supported each other during this program.
- The group attended one of the participating artists Juanella McKenzie UNTOLD panel discussion about the artform of weaving. Juanella provided such beautiful and inspiring insight into her family, culture and art practice. It was a moving presentation with positive feedback from the audience.



#### **PARTICIPANT LOCATIONS**

Each year the SICAD Darwin professional development program targets artists from specific regions within South Australia to ensure that the program is accessible to a range of artists with different experiences and from different language groups. It also enables participating artists to return to their communities to share their experiences, networks, knowledge, and the skills that were gained by participating in the program..

The 2022 program saw many artists submit an EOI for participation in Activate representing communities from across SA, diverse art practices, and multi-generational participation.

Activate program catered for 8 artists from Port Augusta, Adelaide, and Ceduna representing 12 First Nations language groups.



The average age of participants was 41 years, ranging from 17 - 72 years of age.



12 Language groups were represented at the event:

#### INTERNAL EVALUATION

#### **EOI process recommendations**

- In order to reach more artists and overcome barriers for people applying to our programs we could provide a service where staff complete EOI over the phone on behalf of artists.
- Provide a longer lead-up time.
- Distribute EOI process and opportunities through our networks including direct emails.

#### Pre-departure in Adelaide before traveling to Darwin recommendations

- Plan for participants to get to Adelaide the day before traveling to Darwin.
- Program visits to organisation of interest including ACA, Adelaide TAFE, AGSA, SALA exhibitions.

#### **Program delivery - Strengths**

- Having a Ku Arts Director attend the program provided the group with context into Ku Arts' guiding principles and how we work with artists from across SA.
- Group meals enabled group to bond and get to know each other.
- Attending SALON exhibition.
- Meeting with Matt Ward from Outstation who gave excellent advice and feedback on working
  with galleries from an industry perspective. He provided insight into gallery relationships,
  artwork pricing and acknowledged the challenges of independent artists trying to make
  headway in the sector.
- Opening launch of DAAF.
- Attending Mindil Markets, gave participants a chance to experience Darwin sites.
- Coffee debriefs were very important as these gave artists a chance to reflect and discuss the program for the next day.
- DAAF artistic masterclasses gave those interested a creative outlet and an opportunity to learn new skills.
- Participants taking over Ku Arts' Instagram gave tours and insight into the events from their point of view.
- Booking a minivan enabled participants to travel as a group.
- Accommodation was in a great location with good facilities, and enabled participants to share apartments where appropriate.
- The program was a good balance of events and rest time.

#### **Program delivery - Challenges**

- As we arrived late in the evening everything was closed and we were unable to get essential items for the participants.
- Require a cash float for emergencies eg parking, taxis, meals.
- When booking group dinners take into account table service.



#### INTERNAL EVALUATION

#### **Program delivery - Opportunities**

- If budget allows, arriving in Darwin the day before events start will allow time for staff to be more prepared in ensuring participants have everything they need.
- Having a dedicated driver for the program would free up time for the staff and assist with finding car parking and ensure participants can attend more events if they wish.
- Establish a DAAF stall for independent artists hosted by Ku Arts.
- Schedule a daily debrief session to capture feedback and insights from artists as we go.
- Attend Country to Couture and the National Indigenous Fashion Awards.
- Plan a post Activate catch-up in Adelaide with participants, to discuss what's next for their arts practice and how Ku Arts can further support them.
- Plan daily morning debrief with the group.
- Support those artists who are ready to access Tarnanthi online art fair.

#### **Program delivery - Barriers**

- Maintaining energy to participate in a busy schedule of planned / pre-booked activities.
- Lack of support for artists outside of Ku Arts program to access events and programs delivered by other organisations. eg transport to attend events.

#### FEEDBACK FROM PARTICIPANTS

Are there any areas you would have liked to learn more about?

"FASHION INDUSTRY and legal things"

"The gallery we attended with etching art into steel was a great experience.

To see the amazing art and speak with the gallery owner."

"I got a lot out of connecting with galleries such as Outstation.

It's these conversations that are important."

"More galleries to explore."

"I would have loved to learn about expanding my arts business, what opportunities are out there for artists living in South Australia. Also, getting my artwork out & working with galleries & working with new materials, such as printing on fabrics, clothes etc, metal sculpture making & design.".

"I would like to learn more about marketing, social media and get gallery representation."

#### What were some of the benefits to your arts practice in attending this program?

"I was amazed how the business of art is so big and the association of interested buyers and galleries."

"To see artists from regional and remote communities in South Australia connect, to feel confident to enjoy themselves and learn from industry peers was a huge benefit."

"Before traveling home, I visited Premier Art Supplies and saw three participants from the trip there.

To see a young artist inspired to create means this trip was a success."

"I have learned a lot of new skills from other artists. The experience of coming to a different state was very worthwhile and I would do it again in a different state or Darwin again."

"I got a lot more than I expected from this program.

I learned more skills & was inspired by pretty much every artist, including the other artists in our group. I have a whole new outlook & game plan for my art practice."

"Networking, learned a lot, expanded my mind and creativity, inspiration."

"As a finalist of the NATSIAA, KU supported me to come to Darwin and see the exhibition, partake in amazing experiences they organised, and also other opportunities that arose while there.

I also got to meet my cousin sister for the first time thanks to Ku.

The team was amazing and I was able to offer a spare ticket to artist preview to one of the young upcoming artist and help her network.

Ku staff were amazing and were so helpful and kind, I can't say how grateful I am, I am so thankful."

"No I'm so happy how it went."

"Would be good to have the same collective group from this program to have a stall at DAAF 2023, & continue every year giving other artists opportunities."

"Trip was lit, had the best time and had he opportunity to experience things I haven't experienced before Got to meet great people. Was an incredible trip, so grateful."







Darryl Thomas is a proud Nukunu man from Port Augusta. Darryl is a woodcarver and creates boomerangs, wadis and sprears.

"These tools were created by our ancestors and is now a dying art. I wish to pass this on to my children so our art will go on."

#### PAINTER

Munge (David Weetra-Branson) was born in Berri, South Australia in 1975. His parents were travelling through the Riverland looking for fruit-picking jobs at the time. Munge and his family moved to Port Augusta where his mother and father found a house to call home and Munge and his three older sisters and younger brother started schooling.

Munge's father was an Yankunytatjara and Kaurna person and his mother is a Nauo and Nurrunga person. Munge also identifies as an Yankunytatjara, Kaurna, Nauo and Narrunga person and paints all the stories he has learnt from different family groups.

She continues to contribute to the native title process for her people and all native title groups of SA through her involvement on the South Australian Native Title Services Board. An activist and an artist, Lavene has honed her technical and storytelling ability through the photographic medium producing striking, evocative images which speak of connection to country and personal histories.
